• Amends § 19.2-152.7 to require DCJS to report annually on		
the status of each pretrial services agency, including:  1. Amount of funding (local, state, federal, etc.);		
2. Number of investigations and placements;		
3. Average daily caseload;		
4. Success rates; and,		
5. Whether each pretrial services agency is in compliance		
with standards set forth by DCJS. The report should also		
include a plan to address issues within any non-compliant agencies.
