<p>Department of Criminal Justice Services to review pretrial services agencies and report annually</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Amends § 19.2-152.7 to require DCJS to report annually on the status of each pretrial services agency, including: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Amount of funding (local, state, federal, etc.); Number of investigations and placements; Average daily caseload; Success rates; and, Whether each pretrial services agency is in compliance with standards set forth by DCJS. <p>DNA Databank: Adds seven misdemeanors to offenses requiring sample submission</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Amends § 19.2-310.2 to add seven misdemeanors identified by staff as having an association with violent felonies and certain burglary offenses to the list of offenses for which a convicted adult is required to submit a DNA sample for inclusion into the Databank: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Assault and battery (§ 18.2-57); Domestic assault and battery (§ 18.2-57.2); Petit larceny (§ 18.2-96); Trespassing (§ 18.2-119); Destruction of property (§ 18.2-137); Obstruction of justice (§ 18.2-460); and, Conceal merchandise/alter price tags (§ 18.2-103). 	<p>HB 1264 Patron: Toscano</p>	<p>SB 565 Patron: Obenshain</p>
