Scope of Human Trafficking

- \$32 billion industry
 - As large as weapons trafficking
- 12 million victims worldwide
 - 43% sex; 32% labor
 - 80% women; 50% children
- 8.5% convicted offenders to victims identified
- 0.4% victims identified to estimated victims

OVERVIEW OF INCOMING SIGNALS

The following information is based on incoming signals made to the NHTRC from January 1, 2013-December 31, 2013 from individuals in Virginia. **Signals** refer to incoming communications with the NHTRC. Signals can take the form of **phone calls, SMS text** messages, online tip forms, or emails. In 2013, the NHTRC received a total of 35,889 signals nationwide.



Location of Callers*




^{*}These maps only reflect calls in which the caller identified as being in a particular location at the time of the call.

Findings:

- Approximate number of victims
 - 100,000 U.S. children
- Average age:
 - 12-14
- Vulnerability:
 - ANYONE
- Primary barrier to services and intervention:
 - Misidentification

 - Massage Parlors








(*All data is from October 1, 2013 to October 17, 2014*)


- We have received 156 leads since the start of our task force.
- 108 Victims have been recovered and offered services.
- 261 Victims have been identified (13% juveniles).
- 76 Suspects have been identified through our investigations.
- ▶ 17% of the leads received are gang-related.





