Focused Deterrence

- Hot Spot Curve / Flash
- Outdoor Roll Calls in Microlocations
- Community Walks
- Patrol with Community / City and Private Partners
- Traffic Enforcement (SOD)
- Mounted Patrols (SOD)
- Bike Patrol Assignments (Patrol Officers)
- Directed "Steady Blue Light" Patrol
- Extra Duty Officer Coordination
- ✤ Gun Safe Distribution

Focused Enforcement Place Network Investigations

- Crime Sites: Places where crime regularly occurs
- Convergent Settings: Public locations where offenders congregate (Examples: a parking lot, bar, cul de sac, or park)
- Comfort Spaces: Private locations controlled by offenders (Examples: A girlfriend's apartment or a store that tolerates criminals)
- <u>Corrupting Spots</u>: Local business that drives crime (Examples: Stores that buy stolen goods or launder drug money)

Problem-Solving Policing Community Collaboration

- After the micro-locations are stabilized and the Place Network Investigations are completed, a team of stakeholders will meet and review the findings
- Community "Pop-Up" Events (Monthly)
- Non-Profit / Community Associations Partnership Meetings and Updates
- Richmond Community Mediators (RCM) – Bi-Monthly R.A.T. Analysis / Referrals




