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Study Resolution



HJR 97 (Bulova)

- Penalties for taking indecent liberties with children and prostitution offenses involving children.

Law Enforcement Work Group



- SB 847 (2009, Puller) Emergency vehicles proceeding past red lights.
 - This study was deferred due to a pending civil lawsuit. The case was settled Jan. 2010.
 - Executive Committee added a review of police pursuits.
- HB 207 (Alexander) Conduct of police lineups.

Protective Order Work Group



7 bills dealing with protective orders (PO) were referred during the 2010 Session:

- SB 208 (Barker) Adds dating relationships
- HB 164 (Pogge) Allows GPS monitoring
- HB 216 (McClellan) Penalties for violation of PO
- HB 285 (Scott) Adds companion animals to PO
- HB 453 (Herring) Service of PO
- HB 656 (Armstrong) Allows GPS monitoring
- HB 1156 (Oder) Minors may petition for PO

Law-Enforcement Officers Procedural Guarantee Act



SB 287 (Deeds)

- Law-Enforcement Officers Procedural Guarantee Act; definition of law enforcement officer.

Juvenile Transfer and Certification



2 bills were referred dealing with juvenile transfer during the 2010 Session:

- SB 205 (Edwards) Appeals to circuit court.
- SB 389 (McDougle) Adds gang affiliation and drug offenses to list of crimes.
 - Both bills are included as part of ongoing study to review juvenile transfer and certification.

Ongoing Projects



DNA Notification Project:

- Crime Commission Chair serves as a member of the Forensic Science Board (FSB).
- SB 1391 (2009) Directed the FSB to notify convicted individuals that DNA evidence may exist and is available for testing.
- Obtained federal grant funding from NIJ.
- A second individual recently applied for a writ of actual innocence as a result of DNA testing.
